






#### St Cecilia's Class








#### St Bernadette's Class

#### St Christopher's Class

St. Christopher's have started their 'Forces' topic in Science exploring some of the effects of forces in everyday life and investigating magnetic force. They have also had a go at making their own compass in STEM - a great start to our *Explorer's* curriculum! Children showed some great teamwork in Wednesday's PE lesson, which had a focus this week on group challenges. It was fantastic to see the class supporting each other to work through problem solving activities. Our English book – The Man Who Walked Between the Towers has provided excellent stimulus this week for script writing and poetry as well as teaching us how to be ambitious and resilient! All excellent skills for life.

#### **School start times**

The school gate onto the playground will be open at 8:40am and will close just before 8:50am. Children in KS1 should go straight into their classes where teachers will greet them. KS2 children should line up by their class teacher who will take them to class. By 8:50am the children should be in their classes to be registered. Children who arrive in class after this time will be marked as late.

Anyone arriving after the gate has closed must head to the Main Entrance, where you can sign your child in on the electronic screen. Thank you for your co-operation on this. We fully appreciate that there are times beyond our control when we find ourselves late, but it is important that children arrive in school on time to ensure that learning time is maximised.

#### <u>Celebration Assembly every Friday</u>

Parents are welcome to attend our Friday Celebration Assembly if their child has been awarded a certificate. During this assembly, children reflect with staff on the week passed and refer to the theme of the week shared with them on Monday.
