A note from Mrs Thomas and Mrs Boyle

This week saw a change in the Hall at lunchtime! Buddy time was easily the most popular activity in every class, the opportunity to spend it with other children across the school and form those special bonds. The decision to have everyone in the Hall together provides a wonderful, social environment which fosters those Buddy relationships. This week we've seen Borlase return to coach St Christopher's hockey to a high standard, St Bernadette's explore just what happens to your food when you eat it, St Cecilia's becoming weather reporters, learning all about different weather patterns, and our Reception children completing their first full week at St Peter's! Our school continues to be a place where curiosity is encouraged, kindness is celebrated, and every child is supported to reach their full potential. The children look so smart in their uniform – thank you for your support with this. We are also grateful for how prepared the children are for their learning with their well-equipped pencil cases.

Sadly, this week we have noticed an increasing trend of lateness, sometimes there are circumstances outside of your control which means your child is late – we understand this, that's life. However, if you are routinely dropping your child off after 8.50 we would ask that you try and make every effort to arrive on time. Our learning time starts at 8.50 and it is important not to miss the start of lessons as it has a knock-on impact to the whole day.

We have also had complaints from neighbours about poor parking. At this time of year many Year 6 pupils begin walking to and from school by themselves, and by parking on yellow lines, you are breaking the law and also causing obstructions to families and independent children crossing the roads safely. If parking on yellow lines continues, neighbours will be contacting the police- not what we want! If you would like advice on alternative places to park, please come and speak to us and we will gladly give you some nearby options.

FOSP Welcome Picnic

We look forward to seeing some of you at the FOSP BYO (bring your own) Picnic on Saturday. This is set to be a lovely school community event to welcome new families and celebrate 'old' families! This is a free event, a gift from FOSP to you! It will be a lovely relaxing afternoon where children can meet up with their friends and parents can sit back relax and chat with friends. This is a great opportunity for our new families to meet others. A licensed bar will be available for you to purchase a drink or two. We will also have entertainment, from Storm in a Teacup, to interact with the children with bubbles, hoops and plates! Free School Meals - Could you be eligible?

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 get free school meals automatically. But if you receive certain benefits, applying for Free School Meals can help the school get extra funding (called Pupil Premium) to support your child's






St Cecilia's Class
